

Do you need a plumber or septic service?

Step 1

Check if more than one drain is backing up.



← ONE CLOG
Stop! Call a plumber.

MANY CLOGS →
Potential septic issue.



Step 2

Locate the septic system on your property.



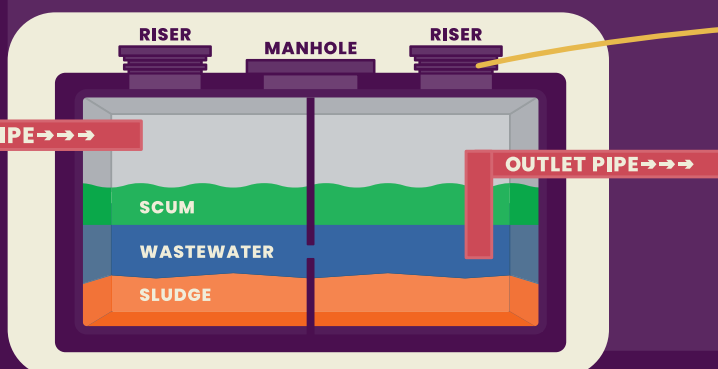
SEPTIC TANK

WELL

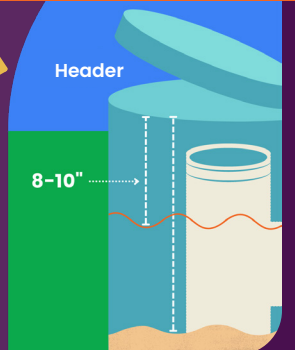
The well and the septic tank will usually be located on opposite sides of the property.

Step 3

Open the header and check the wastewater levels.



There should be an air gap of 8" - 10" between the top of the tank and the wastewater. If your wastewater level is less than 8 inches from the top of the inspection pipe, call ACE!



Step 4

Check the inlet pipe for blockage.



If you see toilet paper or other solid waste build up, carefully unclog it with a small hand tool.

A clogged inlet pipe could be indicative of septic trouble, so call ACE Septic & Waste after you've cleared the blockage.

Step 5
